Eugene Korn has semichah from Pirchei Shoshanim and holds a PhD.in moral philosophy from Columbia University (New York City). He has taught general and Jewish philosophy at Columbia, Yeshiva and Seton Hall Universities. He was founding editor of *The Edah Journal* and has published more than 40 scholarly essays on Jewish thought, Jewish ethics and halakhah and Jewish-Christian relations. His writings have been translated into Hebrew, Spanish, German and Italian. He and his wife, Lila Magnus Korn, made Aliyah in 2014.
